Our March Meeting...

Thursday, April, 14, 1994
Phillips Auditorium, Harvard-Smithsonian
Center for Astrophysics

This month's speaker is Brian Schmidt, a CFA Postdoctoral Fellow. Brian talk is titled "Measuring Extragalactic Distances with Supernovae". Supernovae are among the most luminous events in the Universe, making them attractive objects to use to measure extragalactic distances. Several groups are actively working on a host of distance methods involving different types of supernovae. Type Ia Supernovae have long been promoted as being objects of standard luminosity, and their intrinsic brightness has recently been calibrated using the Hubble Space Telescope. The Expanding Photosphere Method, which provides distances to Type II Supernovae based on atmospheric models of these objects, has been developed. He will discuss the progress of these two methods and the steps being made with them to measure the expansion rate of the Universe, H₀, and its rate of deceleration, Q₀

Observing this impact was the subject of Mike Mattei's and Eric Johannson's presentation. Kevin McCarthy demonstrated his marvelous DTP (Desk Top Polishing) machine that is remarkably compact and portable, yet can handle up to 23-inch diameter mirrors. Finally, Gary Walker showed a CCD image of the section of the Horsehead nebula called the Wales Tail not normally seen in the usual photos.

Special thanks to Mario Motta for reading the meeting minutes and especially Ted Poulos for taking detailed minutes of the March meeting.

A DAY time meteor was observed from Newton at 12:01PM on March 26th by ATMoB member Joseph Rothchild. He observed the meteor within ten degrees of the Southwest horizon as he was driving with his daughter in Newton center. WANT TO experiment with liquid mirrors? See the two articles in the February, 1994 issue of *Scientific American*. The "Amateur Scientist" column describes spinning a dish of epoxy on a phonograph turntable until it hardens. The resultant mirror will have a focal length proportional to the square of the rotation period (41.1cm for 33 RPM). Although precisely parabolic, the mirror's surface may not give diffraction limited images.

How to Find Us...

MEETINGS: Held the second Thursday of each month (September to July) at 8:00PM in Phillips Auditorium, Harvard-Smithsonian Center for Astrophysics, 60 Garden St., Cambridge MA.

CLUBHOUSE: The Tom Britton Clubhouse is open every Saturday from mid-afternoon to late evening. It is the white farmhouse on the grounds of MIT's Haystack Observatory in Westford, MA. Take Rt. 3 North from Rt. 128 or Rt. 495 to exit 33 and proceed West on Rt. 40 for five miles. Turn right at the MIT Lincoln Lab, Haystack Observing at the Groton town line. Proceed to the farm house on the left side of the road. Since clubhouse attendance varies with the weather, it is wise to call in advance: 508-692-8708.
